SIR VENKI RAMAKRISHNAN

Guildhall Arts Centre Theatre Seeing is believing: Revealing the cell's protein factory and how antibiotics block it.

We are delighted to welcome Venki Ramakrishnan, Nobel Prize Winner and President of the Royal Society to the Gravity Fields Festival.

All cells have thousands of proteins that carry out the essential functions of life. The information to make proteins resides in our genes, each of which specifies a particular protein. That information is read by a large molecule called the ribosome, which uses the information to make the protein specified by each gene.
